

**Tour 2:
A bit of everything: Mindo Waterfall-Trail**



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Habitat: Foodhill Forest

At 6 am we go down to Mindo by car. First we follow the Waterfall-Trail uphill still using the car and then start walking. The Waterfall-Trail leads mostly through forest, with some open patches. This mosaic of habitats hosts high species diversity.

Distance: about 5 km

Travelling: walking (getting there and back by car: 30 minutes each way)

Difficulty: easy

Altitude: between 1,100 m and 1,400 m

Species highlights: Crested Guan, Common Squirrel Cuckoo, White-whiskered Hermit, Crimson-rumped Toucanet, Strong-billed Woodcreeper, Slaty Antwren, Yellow-bellied Elaenia, Yellow Tyrannulet, Scale-crested Pygmy-tyrant, Western Ornate Flycatcher, White-capped Dipper, Bay Wren, Beryl-spangled Tanager, Yellow-throated Bush-tanager.

Persons: 1-6

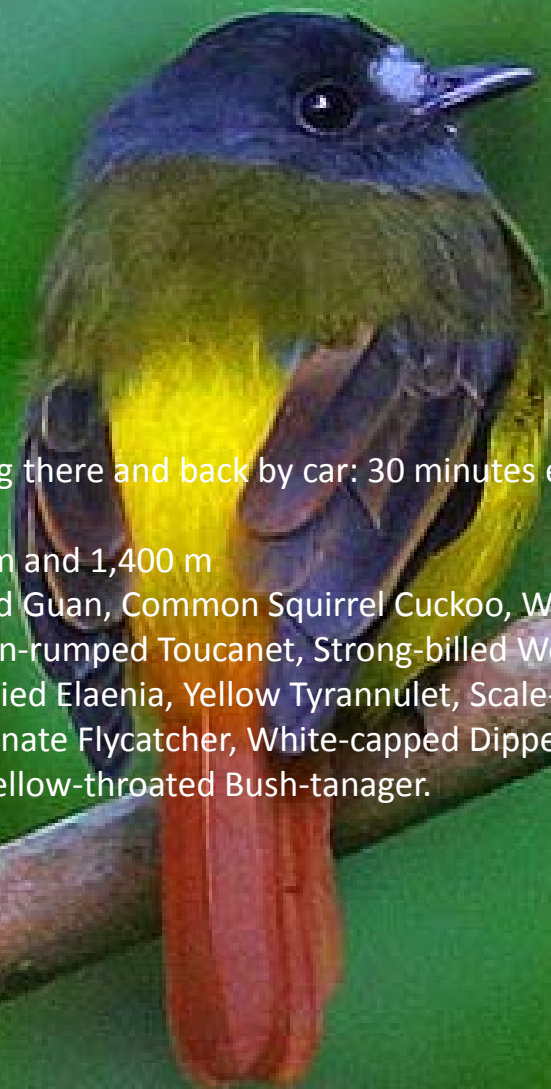
Start/End of Tour (including driving time): 06:00 am until 01.00 pm.

Not included: Food
